Hierarchy of Law

TITLE 07 — LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY · CHAPTER 01 — FORMS OF LAW

- 1 These Fundamental Laws and Principles are supreme.
- 2 Codes enacted under their authority govern defined areas of civil, administrative, and public order.
- 3 Organic Acts organise institutions of State and may establish organs, offices, and procedures.
- 4 Sovereign Decrees execute and implement law and may regulate matters committed to them by Code or Act.
- 5 Administrative Regulations govern internal procedures and the functioning of organs, and shall not impose obligations upon persons outside the administration except as authorised by superior law.
- 6 Customs and constitutional traditions of Kaharagia may be used as interpretive aids and, where expressly recognised, as sources of law.
- 7 In case of conflict between norms of the same rank, the later in time prevails unless otherwise provided; in case of conflict between ranks, the higher rank prevails.
